- The scope of interior design will finally be defined as its own distinct scope in legislation in Ontario. This will be something that ARIDO and its members can refer to when educating public and industry.
- The scope of interior design will be protected so that only those who are qualified can practice the protected scope in the same building types that require BCIN today for small and large buildings.
- Registered Members will receive a stamp once licensed by the OAA. That stamp will be recognized for permit for all residential and commercial Interior Design projects.
- Unqualified individuals will no longer be able to offer commercial interior design services to the public.
- New mechanisms will be in place for greater enforcement of unqualified individuals that goes beyond just the misuse of the title "Interior Designer".
